Dear Mr. Kelly:

Thank you for contacting me with your opposition to the dismissal of Chief Teresa Chambers of the U.S. Park Police. I appreciate having the opportunity to respond to your views.

As you know, Chief Chambers was placed on leave after she publicly stated that her 620-member force was overstretched and underfunded and that the region's parks and parkways were more dangerous as a result. The Park Service has accused Chambers of making remarks that threatened security, improperly revealing budget details and "improper lobbying" of Congress for funding. Donald Murphy, the Park Service's deputy director, informed Chambers that she had "potentially given aid to those who would seek to harm the very facilities, parks and Parkways that you have been charged with protecting," which he claimed to "constitute an 'open' invitation to lawbreakers."

Chambers has responded by claiming that the Park Police acted illegally in dismissing her. The U.S. Parks Police informed Chief Chambers on December 17<sup>th</sup> of their plans to fire her. The Interior Department, which has jurisdiction over the U.S. Parks, plans to make it final decision in the coming days. Please know that I will be paying close attention as we await the federal agencies decision on this important matter.
